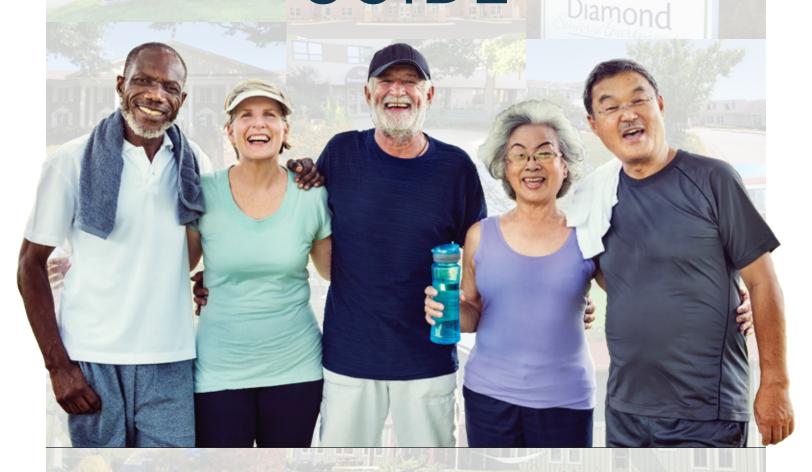

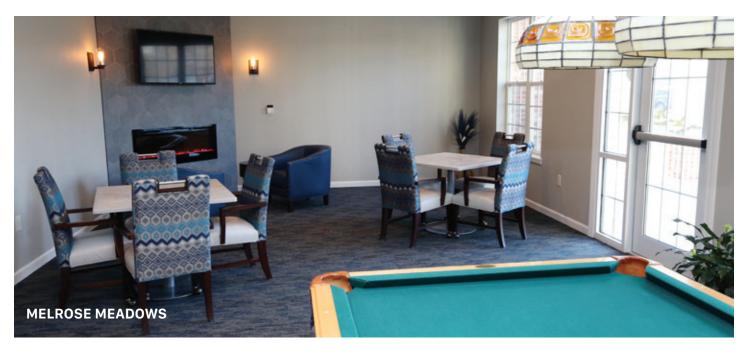

# Like Home



Johnson County is in the midst of a senior-housing boom, with many new facilities becoming available in Iowa City, Coralville, North Liberty, and beyond. Where we live contributes greatly to quality of life, and today there are many more options for what "home" becomes as we age.

While some of us will continue living in large family houses, others are ready to downsize and enjoy worry-free condo living. Still others prefer the comfort and security of senior-living communities. Each of these choices will involve conversations with family members, financial advisors, caregivers, and others who play a role in our health and well-being. There's so much to consider!

TRAIL of Johnson County, Iowa's first aging-in-place organization, exists to help older adults live more fully, safely, and comfortably in the places they call home, whatever and wherever that might be. We recognize that downsizing or moving for other reasons can be among the most difficult decisions we make in later life. This booklet is designed to help you consider questions like these:

- Is the time right for me to move?
- What are the most important factors to consider?
- What types of senior housing are offered in Johnson County?
- What guestions should I be asking of each facility?

In preparing this Senior Housing Guide, TRAIL invited local senior-living facilities in Johnson County to submit content, at no charge, about their primary features, amenities, costs, and other factors. Only those facilities that responded to our request for information are included in this Guide, in alphabetical order by category.

This Guide is presented as a free public service to inform older adults and their families about local senior housing options. It is not an endorsement nor is it meant to rate, rank, or recommend any of the facilities included herein.

Amenities and prices were supplied by the facilities and are current as of August 2020 but are subject to change. Interested persons should contact each facility directly to obtain the latest and most accurate information.

# **GLOSSARY OF TERMS**

Not sure what type of living situation you're looking for? These definitions, provided by AARP, will help you navigate this Guide:

#### INDEPENDENT LIVING

Sometimes referred to as retirement communities, independent living communities offer older adults with limited care needs a simplified lifestyle. They often take the form of apartment complexes with amenities like fitness programs, housekeeping, communal meals, and other services to enrich and simplify life for older adults looking to downsize.

#### **ASSISTED LIVING**

Assisted living communities specialize in providing care and supervision. They frequently offer services like planned activities, housekeeping and laundry, transportation, meals, plus exercise and wellness programs. Assisted living communities sometimes offer limited medical assistance but not skilled nursing.

#### **MEMORY CARE COMMUNITIES**

Memory care communities specialize in providing care to aging adults with Alzheimer's, dementia, and other cognitive issues. Staff members are trained to help with communication and to help residents manage dementia symptoms like sundown syndrome, wandering, or combativeness.



#### **CONTINUING CARE COMMUNITIES**

Continuing care communities usually consist of a campus-like setting offering a variety of housing options that support various stages of life. Spanning independent living, assisted living, and/or skilled nursing care, they enable residents to age in a single community without having to relocate as their needs evolve.

#### **NURSING HOMES**

Nursing homes, also called skilled nursing or longterm care facilities, provide care to those with illnesses or mental conditions requiring full-time monitoring and medical care. Most skilled nursing residents live in semi-private rooms, and meals are generally provided.

#### **COOPERATIVE HOUSING**

In a housing cooperative, residents purchase shares or a membership in a cooperative housing corporation, which owns or leases all real estate. As part of their membership (as shareholders) in the cooperative, residents have an exclusive right to live in a specific unit as long as they adhere to the cooperative's rules and regulations. Residents pay a monthly fee to cover their share of the operating expenses, and they have a vote in the corporation's affairs. Soon to be under construction, with an estimated move-in date of September 2021, the 30-unit Brown Deer Cooperative is a thoughtfully designed community offering active, independent adults age 55 or older a simple and secure alternative to home ownership. Situated on six scenic acres directly adjacent to the Brown Deer Golf Course in Coralville, this form of share ownership offers tax advantages, equity growth, a community lifestyle of like-minded people, and freedom from the hassles of home maintenance responsibilities. Shareholders at Brown Deer Cooperative play a part in the decision making of the day-to-day operations of the cooperative.

Residents will have access to a workout facility with Peloton bikes; community room with a pub, library and fireplace; large community patio with grills and

Individuals interested in reserving a unit are asked to submit a \$500 refundable deposit to be added to the reservation list. Those who have submitted their reservation deposit will be asked to submit a \$1,500 nonrefundable subscription deposit to confirm their unit choice. Both deposits will go toward their share price, and individuals will have 30 days to submit payment or be removed from the reservation list. If individuals are interested in preemptively joining the waiting list once the facility is full, a \$250 refundable deposit is required.

a fire pit; underground parking; a golf simulator for off-season play; bocce ball court; pickle ball court; horseshoe pit; underground car wash bay; monthly cleaning service; while-you-are-away services; and guest suite that can be reserved for shortterm stays by visiting friends or relatives. Units will have a variety of floor plans and balconies; all units will have a screened-in porch with scenic views. Standard amenities include 9-foot ceilings, solid-core wood-paneled doors, fabric roller blinds at all windows and vertical blinds at patio doors, under-counter lighting, quartz countertops, luxury vinyl or wood floor options, walk-in closets, spacious floor plans, laundry room, heated underground parking, and proximity to Brown Deer Golf Course.

In addition to the share price for each unit, a monthly fee covers a variety of expenses, including basic cable and internet, heat, sewer and water, garbage removal, pro rata share of the mortgage, property taxes, insurance, maintenance/home repair, lawn care and snow removal, amenities, and a security system.

The community features two-bedroom, one-bath apartments that include all kitchen appliances and washer and dryer; heat and water is also included in the monthly rent. Community amenities include a community room with a kitchenette, underground heated parking, an outdoor screened gazebo, raised garden beds, high-speed internet, on-site management, and controlled building access.

Coral Ridge Apartments participate in an affordable housing program. Eligibility is based on gross household income (before any deductions) earned from all sources of income. Total household income must be under the limits based on household size.

Coralville Senior Residences offers independent senior living with an affordable Section 8 program. The facility includes 1-bedroom/1-bath apartments with utilities (heat, electric, water, sewer, and trash) included. The building features a community room with social activities, three laundry facilities, elevator, and mail service. It is conveniently located near shopping and the Coralville Public Library. Small pets are welcome.

Amenities include professionally landscaped grounds and 24-hour emergency maintenance. Our one-bedroom apartments are air conditioned and include a range, refrigerator, and all utilities. Each apartment has its own patio or balcony.

Diamond Senior Housing provides 1- and 2-bedroom units, ranging in size from 600 to 900 square feet, located five minutes from downtown lowa City. Each unit is equipped with a spacious living room, master bedroom, kitchen, large bathroom, and many extra closets. Each unit is also provided with a parking space. Other amenities include an exercise room, activity area, and lobby that can be used as a meeting place. The building is wheelchair accessible. Small pets are welcome but require a pet deposit. Both market rate and income-restricted rate apartments are available. There is a \$35 application fee and a \$500 deposit that may be refundable depending on individual circumstances. Rental fees increase yearly.

Diamond also includes four market-rate apartments at \$936/month.





Ecumenical Towers is located in downtown lowa City. adjacent to the Iowa City/Johnson County Senior Center. The building includes 81 apartments: 71 onebedroom apartments and 10 studio apartments. Of these 81, eight are mobility accessible apartments. Gas, electric, trash and sewer utilities are included in the rent. A telephone and cable television are available at the tenant's expense. A reserved covered parking space is available in the lower level of the Iowa Avenue parking ramp. There are a central laundry facility and large community room for social events and family gatherings. Ecumenical Towers has a service coordinator on staff who is able to help residents arrange to receive any and all services they need from one or more of the many service agencies in the county.

Prairie Hill Cohousing is a multi-generational community situated on eight acres of land on Miller Avenue, just south of Benton Hill Park. The community is a mile and a half from downtown lowa City and within walking/biking distance to campus, close to a grocery store, restaurants, and city and university bus stops. Residents say they came here for the sense of community and shared activities. They are caring for each other during this time of COVID.

The community is building 36 eco-friendly residences clustered around a common house with adjacent community gardens and orchards. Each household has a private kitchen and bath as well as access to shared facilities in the common house. The common house is the heart of the community, with many opportunities to visit with neighbors

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Adults or families welcome, no age limits

#### COST

Home costs are comparable to newly constructed homes of similar size in lowa City. The community does the development themselves, so there is no developer's profit to pay. The monthly fee for the upkeep of the common areas, insurance, snow plowing, etc. runs around \$200 - \$250.



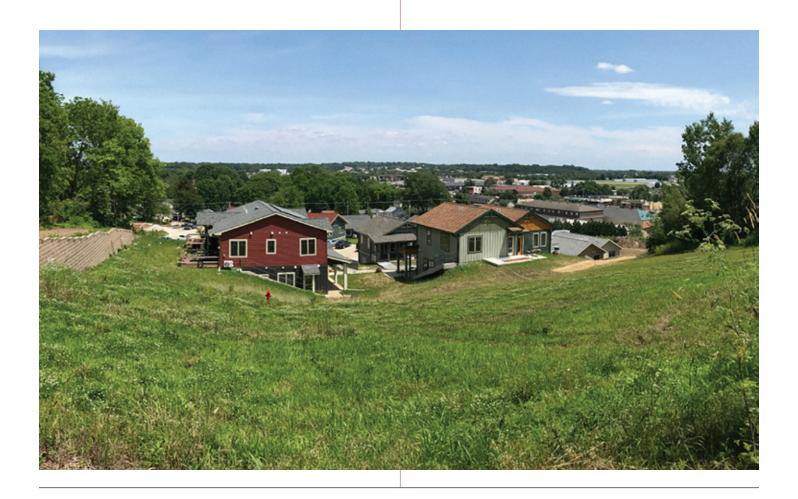
and friends, and it includes a large kitchen and dining room for shared weekly meals, as well as guest rooms, laundry, activity/exercise room, and living room.

Individual living units tend to be smaller than usual with a mix of studio apartments and 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom units. All are built in accordance with environmentally sound principles to LEED standards and all buildings are solar ready. Some have solar panels already installed.

Joining Prairie Hill Cohousing is a multi-stage process designed to help prospective members get to know the community and evaluate whether it will be a good fit for them. Members make a nonrefundable payment of \$1,000 when they join the community — a \$100 application fee and a \$900

membership fee. Upon joining the community, members make a down payment toward the purchase price of their home.

Responsibilities within the Prairie Hill community are shared, and decisions are made using sociocracy, a consent process that ensures each person has an equal voice. Everyone at Prairie Hill chooses to work with one or more work circles responsible for areas such as community life, land and garden, buildings, finance, and legal.

Vintage Cooperative is an independent ownership model. The cooperative holds the master mortgage, allowing members to own a share of the cooperative without assuming personal liability. Monthly charges pay for operating expenses: utilities, insurance, maintenance, real estate taxes, and debt service on any master mortgage and reserves. Standard home amenities include a deck/patio, horizontal blinds on all windows, refrigerator, dishwasher, smooth-top stove with oven, microwave, disposal, and large capacity washer and dryer.

Common areas include a community room with kitchen, a great room with a fireplace, fitness center, fireside lounge, club room, library, workshop, guest suite for visiting family and friends, garden plots, heated underground parking, and bike storage.

Independent living apartments include two meals a day, light housekeeping, transportation, utilities (except phone), cable and internet, a wellness center, and social activities. Assisted living apartments include amenities listed above (three meals a day, however) as well as a 24/7 personal care service: medication management, bathing, dressing, grooming, bathroom assistance, reminders, and other daily activities such as making the bed. All units are pet friendly.

Bickford Senior Living is a family-owned and operated community. Both long- and short-term (respite) stays are offered. The lowa City branch has 37 private apartments, including studios and 1-bedroom units, featuring private bathroom with handicapped showers and kitchenettes. Apartments can be customized as the resident chooses and pets and visitors are welcome. Bickford is completely secure, making it a safe environment for those who are needing a secure and safe home.

Individualized service plans allow residents to get exactly what they desire in personal care, medication and mobility assistance, health care coordination, memory care, dining, housekeeping, and socialization. Multidenominational religious services are provided. Beauty, barber, audiology, podiatry, physical therapy, lab, and wound care services are offered on site. Residents are encouraged to "take ownership" of their community to lead activities and participate in menu planning and community meetings.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Residents must be 18 or older and have utilized assistance through VA benefits and long-term care insurance.

#### COST

Bickford offers three styles of apartments and five levels of care. In order to provide an accurate estimate of costs, a service assessment must be completed. Bickford is a private-pay community resource. Rates are based upon apartment size and level of care. For all plans, there is a one-time community fee of \$2,500 per apartment.

#### **SECURE MEMORY CARE**

Private studio suite apartments are available in the secure memory care area. Residents who need closer care with one-on-one interactions for socialization and activities of daily living can reside in a secure area with trained staff to provide positive life experiences according to each resident's individual needs and preferences. Some of the special services offered in the memory care area include music therapy, wellness programs, private dining, and a secure patio and garden.

#### **RESPITE**

An all-inclusive Respite Program is available for individuals who need supervision and/or services for a short period of time, typically a minimum of three days and a maximum of 60 days. Respite stay services include all the same services one would receive as a permanent resident in this community. This program is ideal for those who have a caregiver out of town, a spouse in the hospital, someone who is in need of additional recuperation time from a hospital stay, or simply to determine if assisted living is the right decision for an individual on a long-term basis.

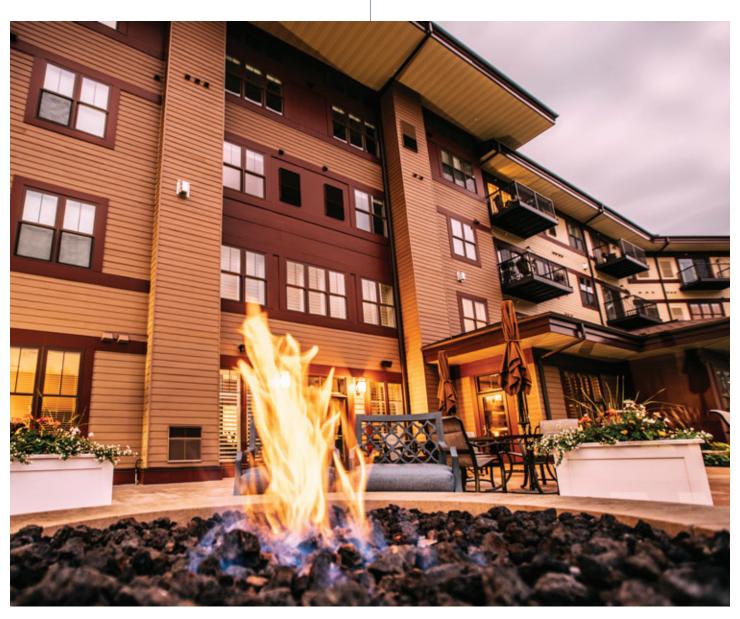

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

Oaknoll serves residents who are 62 and older. To qualify for LifeCare, each individual must be able to live independently. Then, as health needs change, Oaknoll residents are guaranteed care in Assisted Living or the Health Center. Prospective residents should call Steve Roe, Executive Director, at (319) 351-1720 to schedule an appointment and tour. Application materials include a medical screening (completed by the prospective resident's physician) and a financial disclosure.

#### COST

Costs vary significantly depending on the size and location of the apartment. One-person entrance fees range from \$97,260 to \$617,520; one-person monthly fees range from \$2,127 to \$3,305. When additional health services are needed by the resident, the cost stays the same. The two-person entrance fees range from \$123,310 to \$772,450; two-person monthly fees range from \$3,854 to \$5,655. The value of LifeCare for a two-person household is significant. If one member needs additional health services, the cost for the couple stays the same even though two different spaces are being occupied (i.e., the Independent Living apartment and a nursing bed in the Health Center).

**AMENITIES:** Three dining venues (Oak Room, Third on Third Bistro, or the Hope Dining & Café), private rooms for large group or family dinner parties, pub lounge serving drinks and food daily, internet café with patio seating, movie theater, hair salon and spa, golf simulator, art studio, community room, lounges and libraries offered throughout the campus, and a Wellness Center (exercise equipment specifically designed for the more mature exerciser).

ACTIVITIES AND PROGRAMS: A full-time

recreation staff person coordinates stimulating programs and recreational activities—trips and outings, lectures, movies, live theater performances, live outdoor music concerts with dinner, game nights, themed parties, and much more. In-town transportation services keep residents on the go. Wellness classes include light aerobic workouts, yoga, Pilates, boot camp, walking groups, and water aerobics classes. Also available are a warm water/lap swimming pool with water current to walk or swim against resistance, hot tub, and bubble seat.

**INDEPENDENT LIVING:** 50 different floor plans are offered, depending on personal preferences for layout, location, and lifestyle. Independent Living apartments range in size from 1-bedroom apartments (379 sq. ft.) to spacious and comfortable 2- and 3-bedroom apartments with study, balconies, and screened-in and four-season sun porches (up to 2,612 sq. ft.).

**ASSISTED LIVING:** The certified Assisted Living area consists of 38 apartments and provides services and programs that support residents who may need additional assistance in their daily lives. Assisted Living is only available to Oaknoll residents who have lived independently in an apartment and now need additional services. Residents continue to pay the same monthly apartment service fee that they did living in their Independent Living apartment. The following basic services are provided at no additional charge: 24-hour nursing supervision; laundry services; housekeeping and maintenance; shopping and errands; transportation; monitoring of vital signs, weight, and health care conditions; application of medically necessary treatments; medication supervision and administration; Social Services; and daily programming and activities (social, religious, educational and exercise).

**HEALTH CENTER SERVICES:** Oaknoll offers a 58-bed Health Center with 52 private rooms and three double rooms (reserved for couples, partners, siblings, etc., that want to continue living together). Thirty-two beds are licensed for Skilled Nursing Care—the highest level of nursing outside a hospital setting. Ten of the private rooms are in The Loft, a self-contained memory care unit with a neighborhood feel serving primarily residents living with Alzheimer's disease or other types of dementia. Residents in the Health Center pay the same rate as they did for their Independent Living apartment, plus additional meals. The services of the resident's personal physician, other specialists, and the cost of prescriptions are paid by the resident, just like they would be if they were in their own apartment.

SHORT STAY SERVICES: Oaknoll also offers a Short Stay Unit (SSU) for those 62 and older. It is an extension of the licensed Health Center with nursing staff trained to provide skilled nursing care. It is designed for short-term rehabilitative stay after a scheduled surgery or an unexpected health condition (priority based on room availability is given to Oaknoll residents and Preferred Access List members). The Short Stay Unit is self-contained and includes 10 private rooms, each with large bathrooms and walk-in showers. Within the unit is a Therapy Suite that provides physical, occupational, and speech therapy. Consultation staff is also available (dietetics, dental, and podiatry) as well as housekeeping services, whirlpool spa, Wi-Fi/internet access, cable TV, private phone, activities, and programs. Salon services are available (haircut, manicure, pedicure, or therapeutic massage), and clothing/laundry services and emergency transportation can also be arranged. Meals are available from all three Oaknoll dining venues.

AT HOME WITH OAKNOLL: Oaknoll recently extended services to the greater lowa City-Cedar Rapids corridor community in clients' homes. At Home clients receive the same reputable care and support Oaknoll has been providing to its residents for more than 50 years. Home health caregiver and personal assistant services are offered on an individual, as-needed basis, seven days/week. 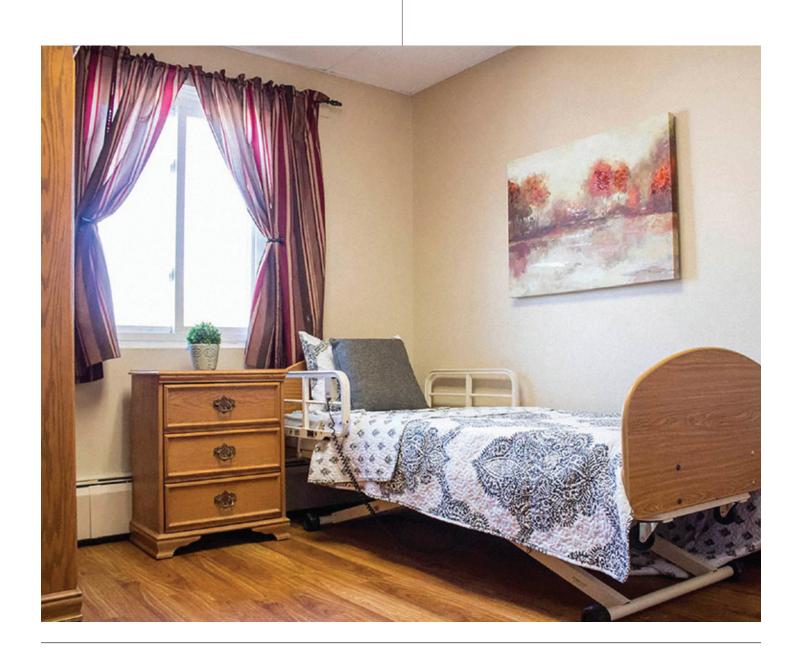

## **GETTING STARTED**

### **Advice for Your Senior Housing Search**

The nonprofit Where You Live Matters offers these top 12 tips to consider as you weigh the various senior housing options, whether here in Johnson County or elsewhere in the country.

#### 1. Know what you need.

Make an objective list of services and supports needed — both current and anticipated. Maintaining independence, getting help with bathing and dressing, managing medication, maximizing safety; knowing upfront what's needed can help define budget and choice.

#### 2. Establish a budget.

How much can be spent on senior living each month? Many of your current homeowner expenses will be included in monthly fees, such as meals, utilities, and taxes, for example. And as you're planning, be mindful of other financial resources that can help, such as long-term care insurance or the Aid & Attendance benefit for veterans and their surviving spouses. Don't overlook any resources that can help you and your family.

#### 3. Determine a location.

The real estate mantra — location, location, location — applies. Is it meaningful to stay close to your current neighborhood? Is being close to a major medical center important? Or is a move in order to reposition seniors for the sake of adult children, grandchildren, and greatgrandchildren? Which location is "it"?

#### 4. List desires.

What are the "must-have" services and amenities? Your list should include whatever is non-negotiable in making this move — a community that accepts pets or offers a comprehensive wellness program, for example. You should also create a "wish list" of everything hoped for, such as an on-site guest suite for visiting family members, a fitness center with pool, or an in-house branch of a favorite bank.

#### 5. Visit websites.

Search online for senior living communities in the desired location. The community's website should describe services and amenities, the continuum of care available, and life enrichment programs. Some communities also provide general information about successful aging, caregiver support, and senior living. Make a list of the communities you'd like to know more about or want to visit.

#### 6. Read online reviews.

Find a community you'd like to know more about. Check www.Caring.com, www.SeniorAdvisor.com, and even Angie's List for reviews that can tell you what current and previous residents and families have to say about the community you're interested in.

#### WHERE YOU LIVE MATTERS: www.whereyoulivematters.org

#### 7. Don't forget about Facebook.

Look up the Facebook page for each community that interests you. Read the comments. Look at the photos. See what you can learn about lifestyle, residents, activities, programs — even the quality of dining.

#### 8. Ask around.

Anyone who's been through the process — whether it was for themselves or on behalf of a loved one — can usually offer helpful insights. Similarly, you can often find good information and advice from a trusted family physician or clergy member. Ask friends, family, colleagues — you may discover ideas you haven't thought about or information you need to know.

#### 9. Make preliminary contact.

Shorten a long list of potential communities by phoning or emailing. Prepare a list of questions, based on the identified needs, desires, and budget. Preliminary contact can trim your list, while also making it clear which communities will be important to visit in person.

#### 10. Go visit.

An in-person visit pays huge dividends when it comes to making an informed decision. Here's what to watch for: How do residents and staff interact? What's the mood of the community? Are residents actively engaged, sitting quietly, or out of sight? Do you see safety features such as handrails, grab bars and emergency call systems? Is it clean? Is the decorating up-to-date? Does it feel

like a place you could call home? Are you greeted promptly and with friendliness? Ask questions and take notes — and consider bringing along a friend or relative so you can join forces to observe everything.

#### 11. Review and revisit.

After completing the initial round of community visits, review your notes and observations. Narrow your list a little more by identifying which communities are good options and which you'd like to eliminate. Schedule a new round of visits to your shortened list of communities, making sure you return to each community at a different time than your last visit — even consider visiting evenings and weekends. It's helpful to see the community during the times when senior management isn't on site.

#### 12. Consult an attorney.

Seek professional advice. Don't go it alone; mistakes here can be very expensive, both financially and emotionally. Retirement community contracts can be long and complicated. Make sure you understand the ins and outs of everything before you sign anything.
